Patricia Braun MD, MPH, FAAP is a Professor of Pediatrics, Public Health and Dental Medicine at the University of Colorado and has practiced pediatrics at Denver Health, a large safety net healthcare system for over 25 years. She is the immediate past-chair of the American Academy of Pediatrics Section of Oral Health Executive Committee and a past Santa Fe Group Policy Fellow. She is leading the evaluation of the Colorado Medical Dental Integration Project and is also the Project Director for the HRSA-funded Rocky Mountain Network for Oral Health Integration.



Jane Grover, DDS, MPH

Dr. Jane Grover became the Director of the Council on Advocacy for Access and Prevention of the American Dental Association in April 2013. She oversees Association activities on topics including community water fluoridation, school based dental programs, community health center, access to care and funding of public health dental programs.
