# Title V Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant to States

FY 2020 Budget = \$687.7 M



- Largest Investment, 55 million people in FY2018

# Title V: Special Projects of Regional And National Significance (SPRANS)

- Diverse portfolio of investments
  - Promotes **efficiency** and facilitates **collaborative learning** across States
    - ✓ National Survey of Children's Health
    - ✓ Bright Futures
  - Addresses national & regional **emerging issues** such as maternal mortality, opioids, & childhood obesity
  - Supports Congressional **set-asides & priorities**





# Maternal, Infant, Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program

FY 2020 Budget = \$400M (Mandatory)



## Program Features

- Voluntary
- Evidence-based
- Support at-risk pregnant women and parents of young children



## Aims

- Prevent child abuse & neglect
- Support parenting
- Improve development & school readiness
- Promote family economic self-sufficiency

# Healthy Start

FY 2020 Budget = \$125.5M

- Focus on communities with highest infant mortality rates
- Support community-driven efforts to decrease infant mortality
  - In FY 2018, the program's 101 grantees served **more than 81,000 women & children** in 34 states, Puerto Rico, and D.C.

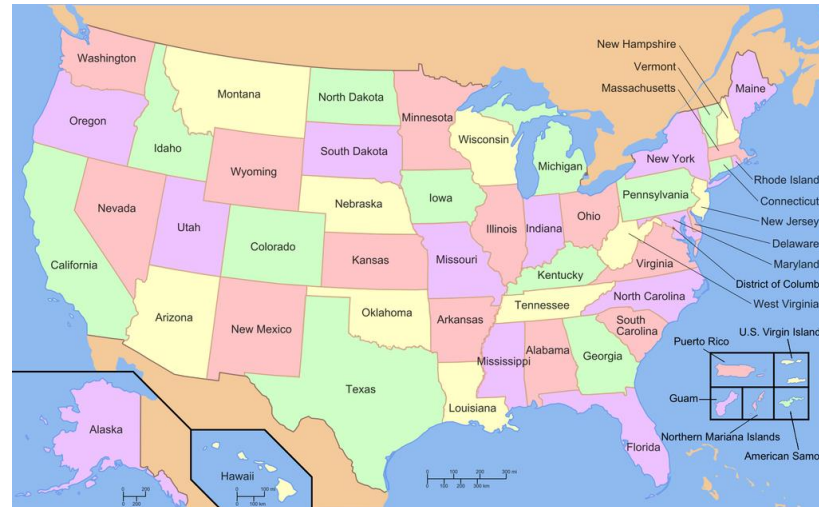
