

Kentucky Statistics for Speech on July 25, 2010

- In 2009, Kentucky exports valued \$17.6 Billion. (\$17,608,952,000)
 - Down 7.9% from 2008. (\$19,120,585,559)

- In 2009, Kentucky's largest trading partner by value was Canada, exporting \$4.8 B.
 - Top 5 Trading Partners in 2009
 1. Canada: \$4.8 B
 2. France: \$1.85 B
 3. United Kingdom: \$1.14 B
 4. Mexico: \$1 B
 5. Brazil: \$897 M

 - In 2008, Japan was Kentucky's fifth largest trading partner by export value with \$839 M, though the recession and the sharp increase of 61% in exporting value to Brazil from 2008 to 2009 bumped Japan to #6 (\$821 M in 2009).

- In 2009, Kentucky had the 12th highest export value to Canada of the United States.
- In 2009, Kentucky had the 6th highest export value to Brazil of the United States.
- In 2009, Kentucky firms' exports to China increased 21%, compared to the previous year.

- In 2009, "Transportation Equipment" composed the greatest percentage of Kentucky's export value, nearly 40% (by NAISC code).
 - Top 5 Product Categories for Exports by NAISC'
 1. Transportation Equipment: 39.6%
 2. Chemical Manufactures: 18.4%
 3. Machine Manufactures: 8.2%
 4. Computer and Electronic Products: 7.9%
 5. Primary Metals Manufactures: 3.2%

 - 92% of Kentucky exports to France are of the category "transportation equipment."
 - 43% of Kentucky exports to Canada are of the category "transportation equipment."
 - 27% of Kentucky exports to Japan are of the category "chemical manufactures," while only 20% are of "transportation equipment."
 - 18% of Kentucky exports to Mexico are of "primary metal manufactures."
 - 50% of Kentucky exports to Europe are of "transportation equipment."
 - Kentucky exports to Asia are mainly composed of "chemical manufactures" (26.3%) and "transportation equipment" (26.1%).
