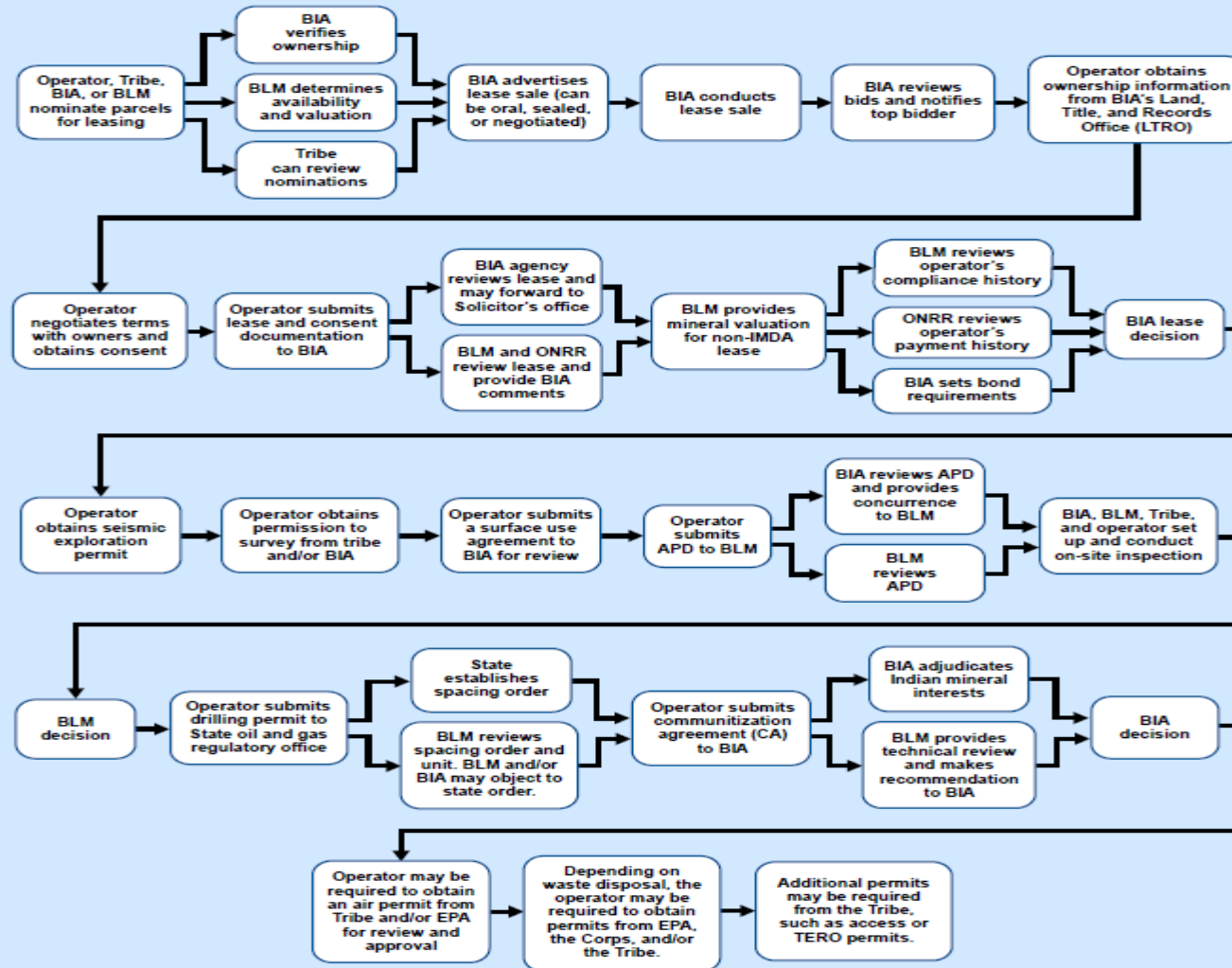

Indian Oil/Gas Process



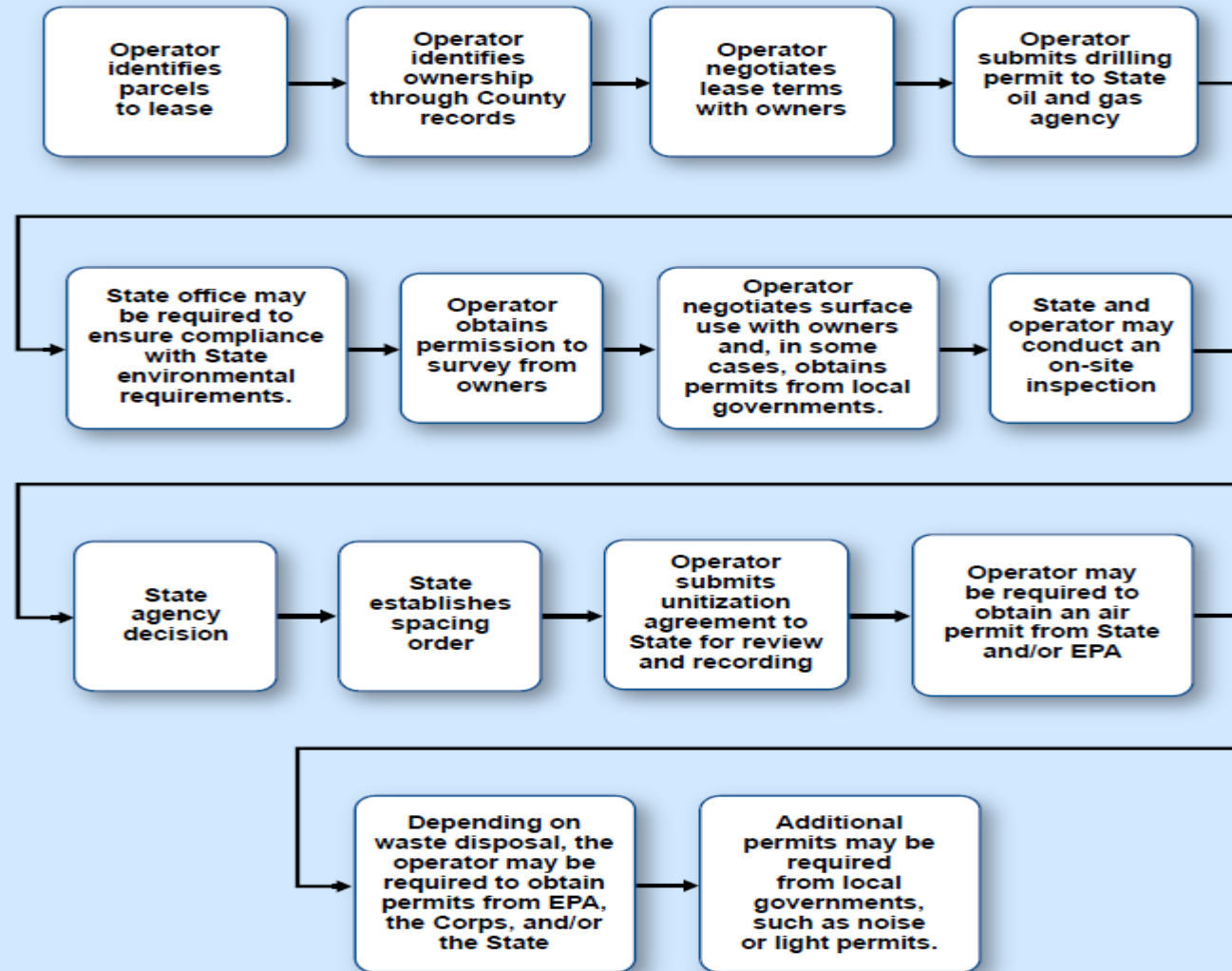

BIA is to encode and record leases and communitization agreements in its Trust Asset and Accounting Management System (TAAMS). This step is not included in the process chart.

In some cases, a tribal resolution may be required before BIA approves ROW agreements.

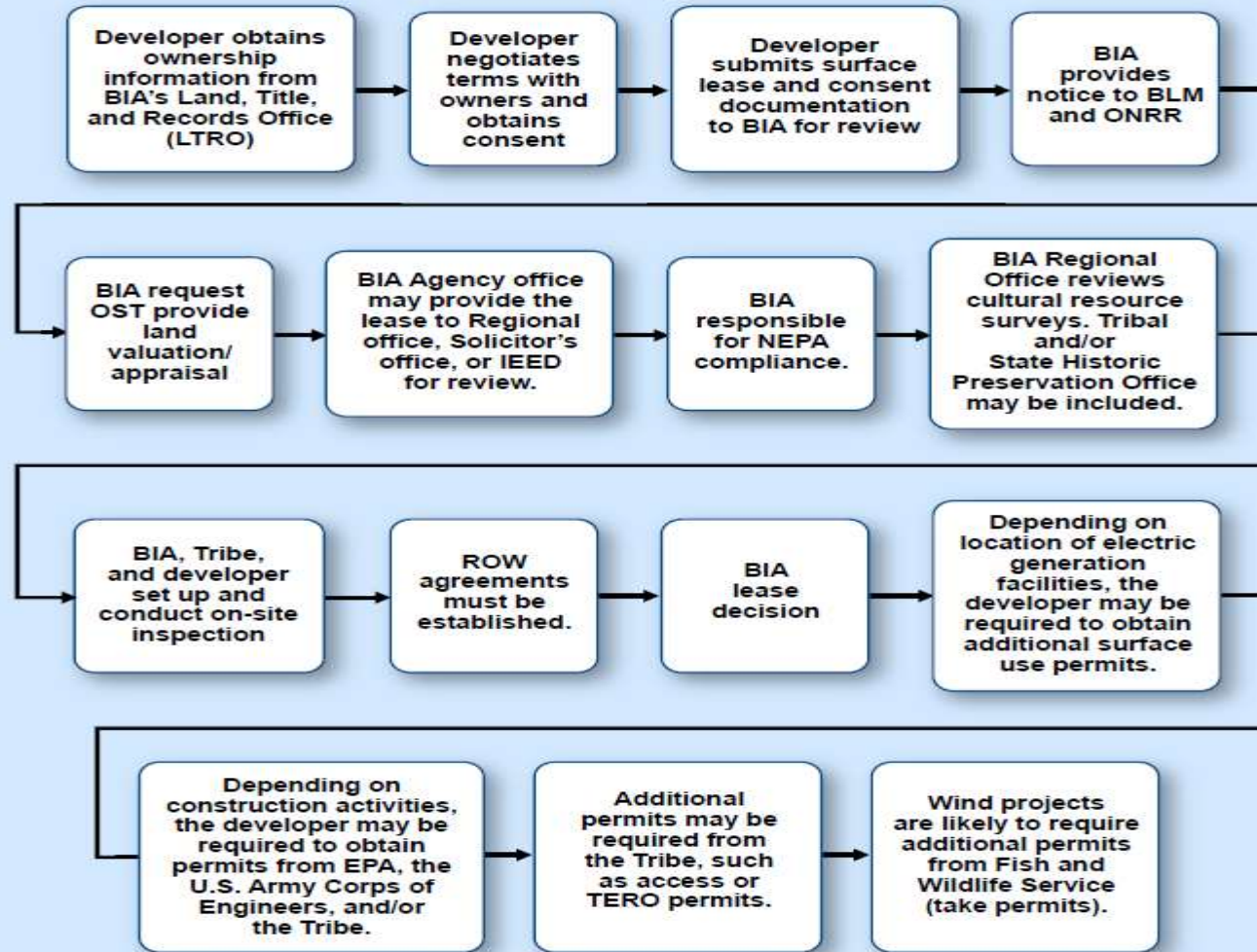
The leasing activities depicted on this graphic are not relevant for leases approved under the Indian Mineral Development Act (IMDA).

Indian Renewable Process

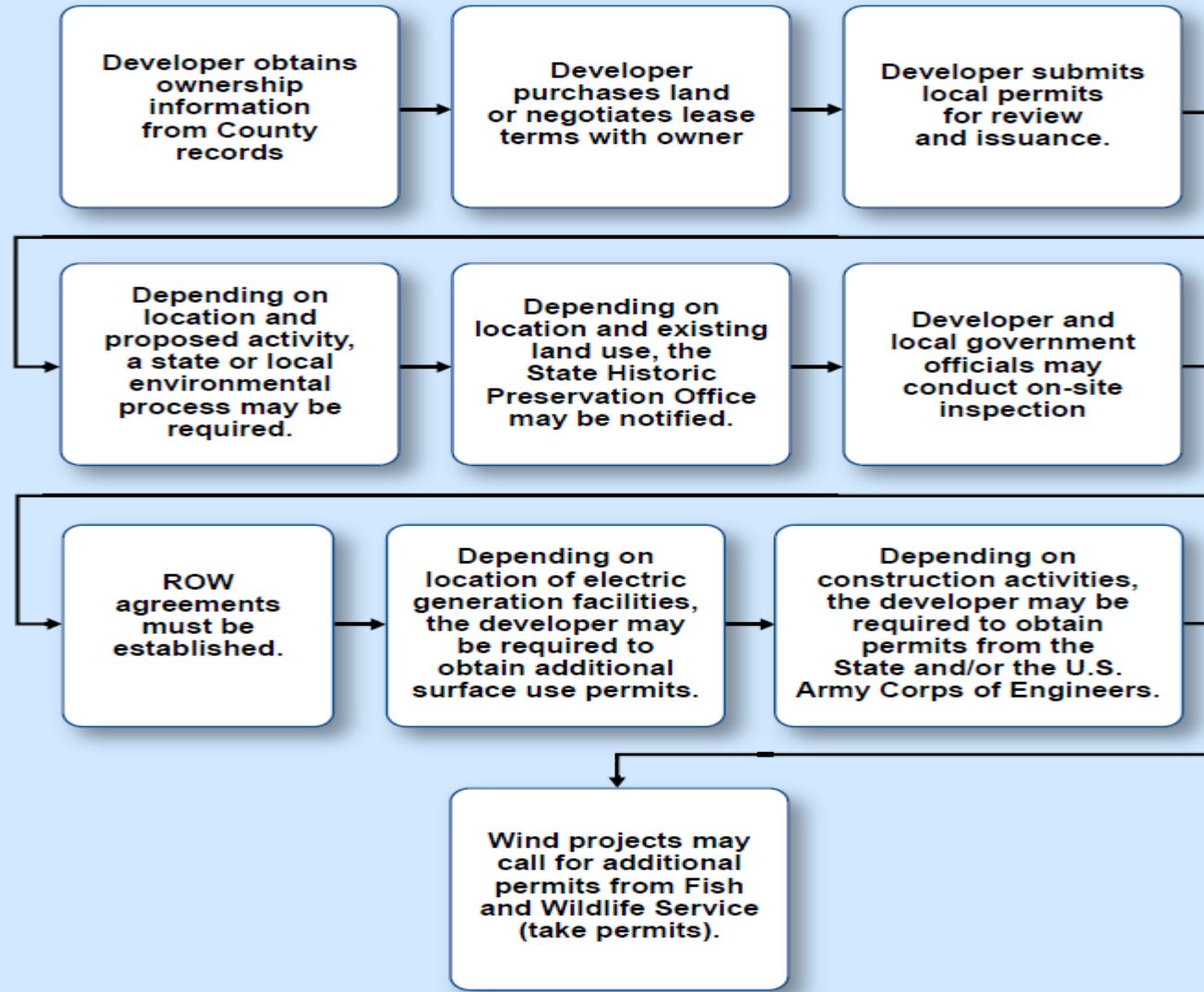
