JOINT SESSION BETWEEN ICEIWG AND NCSL'S TASK FORCE ON ENERGY SUPPLY: NEW TECHNOLOGIES OFFER OPPORTUNITIES IN INDIAN COUNTRY

Many rural communities and Indian reservations have homes dispersed over large areas, often far from the power grid. Extending utility distribution lines to these rural or less populated areas is expensive, but advancements, smart grid efforts and new technologies offer opportunities to power tribal nations and rural communities. Microgrids, which can operate autonomously from the larger grid, can be used to bolster resilience and provide consistent power. This session will discuss recent developments associated with grid modernization across the country, how advanced technologies may offer innovation solutions, and highlight the unique opportunities and barriers associated with Navajo Nation's tribal utility authority.
