




BBA made budgeting easy






Side agreement funding





\$2+ billion in new spending






President, Congress out of sync



- President's budget on the sidelines
- BBA to serve as budget resolution
 - House acted for political purposes
 - Senate will stick with BBA
- No budget resolution, no reconciliation
- November election an important backdrop

House, Senate actions of note



- Jim Martin table has details
- Few eliminations, targeted reductions
- Reductions more likely in House
- Lots of programs level funded
- FY 2018 priorities remain: opioids, child care, infrastructure, etc. (from side agreement)

Other agenda items



Opioids

- Medicaid, new grants, grant reauthorizations
- Major differences between House and Senate bills

Farm Bill

- Expires 9/30/18
- Conference: SNAP work rules, eligibility, performance bonuses

TANF

- Expires 9/30/18
- House bill: work requirements, outcomes, limits on how states spend funds

Others

 FAA, Perkins, water resources, public health preparedness, government reorganization

What's in play?



FY 2019 appropriations

- Higher caps
- Most progress in years
- May enact a few spending bills; CR likely

Other stuff...


- Supreme Court nomination
- Opioids: likely
- Farm Bill, TANF: require bipartisan support
