<sup>2</sup> Does not require comprehensive data on use of force, limited to deadly use of force as defined in the bill

<sup>3</sup> Directs AG to create policy banning chokeholds "except when deadly force is authorized".

<sup>4</sup> Limits funding to states unless they ban chokeholds "except when deadly force authorized"

<sup>5</sup> Limits funding to states unless provide reports on use of no-knock warrants

<sup>6</sup> Grants to require training on duty to intervene, but not for federal officers

<sup>7</sup> Also includes dash cameras

<sup>8</sup> State grants for body cameras but no federal requirement, no dash camera requirements
