

COMPOUNDING PHARMACIES | Alabama

State	Enacted	Bill Number	Bill Summary
Alabama	2015	AL H 8	Provides a specified state "supplemental privilege tax" (or provider tax) for each prescription filled or refilled, to be collected on the business activities of every provider of pharmaceutical services to the citizens of Alabama, except for a pharmacy serving hospital in-patients or pharmacies operated by the State of Alabama, for collection in fiscal years 2016 and 2017. The "revenue generated from this tax will be eligible for Federal Medicaid matching funds (FMAP), being that portion of funds paid by the federal government to the State of Alabama for providing and administering the State's Medicaid Program. The tax would be void if it is not eligible for such matching funds.
Alabama	2012	AL H 393	Relates to the practice of pharmacy and the operation of pharmacies; defines pharmacy services; authorizes the Alabama State Board of Pharmacy to provide by rule for the issuance, renewal, and fees relating to a pharmacy services permit; provides that the creation of a pharmacy services permit does not expand or limit the existing practice of pharmacy or medicine.
Alabama	2012	AL S 383	Relates to audits of pharmacy records; establishes minimum and uniform standards and criteria for the audit of pharmacy records by or on behalf of certain entities; prescribes the procedures for conducting an audit; provides for an appeal process; provides that an entity conducting an audit may not use the accounting practice of extrapolation in calculating recoupments or penalties for audits.
Alabama	2012	AL H 566	Relates to prescription drugs; allows a named federally qualified health care center and public health facility to compound and dispense non-controlled substances at one location and deliver the medications to clinics for patient pick-up.

California	2015	CA A 486	Requires that certain information be displayed on a human-readable unit-dose label, and that information to be retrievable by a pharmacist using the medication lot number or control number. Requires a medication barcode to be machine readable, using medication administration software, and that the software compare certain information to the electronic medical record of an inpatient in order to verify that the medication to be given is the correct medication, dosage, and route of administration.
California	2013	CA S 294	Prohibits a pharmacy from compounding or dispensing, and a nonresident pharmacy from compounding for shipment into this state, sterile drug products for injection, administration into the eye, or inhalation, unless the pharmacy has obtained a sterile compounding pharmacy license from the Board of Pharmacy. Specifies requirements for the issuance or renewal of a license, and requirements for the pharmacy as a licensee.

Colorado	2016	CO H 1152	Authorizes the Department of Corrections to distribute compounded and prepackaged medications to pharmacies under the same ownership as the department.
Colorado	2012	CO H 1311	Relates to the continuation of the State Board of Pharmacy, the rehabilitation evaluation committee and transfers its duties to the state board, license fee increase to cover the costs of the Pharmacy Peer Health Assistance Program, hospital satellite pharmacies, veterinary prescription drug wholesalers, board letters of admonition, pharmacist managers, interns, and prescription requirements.

Florida	2016	FL H 977	Relates to the behavioral health workforce to include prescribing name brand drugs, advanced registered nurse practitioner or a physician assistant, patient admission to a treatment facility, pain-management clinic prescribing, the Board of Nursing, controlled substances formulary, continued education, disciplinary action, nonresident sterile compounding permits, volunteer nurses, anesthesiologist assistants, disability parking endorsement, and community control conditions.

Georgia	2016	GA H 926	Relates to pharmacists and pharmacies, provides for licensure of third-party logistics providers, provides for temporary pharmacy licenses for service members, requires that compounding of drug products for use in a practitioner's office can only be conducted by outsourcing facilities to conform to federal law, provides for drug supply chain security, relates to the return of outdated drugs, provides wholesale distributors, warehousing, chain pharmacies, reverse drug distributors and out-of-state firms.
Georgia	2013	GA H 209	Relates to pharmacists and pharmacies, provides for license transfers for pharmacists licensed in another jurisdiction, relates to dispensing prescription drugs, use of security paper for hard copy prescription drug orders, compounding drug products, nonresident pharmacy permits and the electronic data base of prescription information, revises the definition of a dispenser relative to information to include for each Schedule II, III, IV, or V controlled substance prescription.

Maryland	2013	MD H 986	Requires a sterile compounding facility to hold a sterile compounding permit issued by the State Board of Pharmacy before the sterile compounding facility may perform sterile compounding in the State, provides that a sterile compounding permit is required in addition to and does not replace other permits or licenses, provides that a person that prepares and distributes sterile drug products into or within the State is not required to hold a sterile compounding permit but shall hold certain other permits.

Utah	2012	UT H 76	Requires health benefit plans, the Public Employees' Benefits and Insurance Program, and pharmacy benefit managers to implement certain pharmacy audit procedures when auditing pharmacy claims; requires a health insurer and a pharmacy benefits manager for a health insurer to comply with pharmacy audit rights established in the Pharmacy Practice Act; requires the Public Employees' Benefit and Insurance Program to comply with pharmacy audit rights established in the Pharmacy Practice Act.

Virginia	2012	VA H 733	Relates to pharmacists; relates to compounding authority; increases pharmacists' authority to compound to allow the compounding of a commercially manufactured drug whose manufacturer has notified the FDA that the drug is unavailable due to a current drug shortage, or a commercially manufactured drug when the prescriber has indicated in the prescription for an individual patient that there is an emergent need for a drug that is not readily available within the medically necessary time.
Virginia	2012	VA S 294	Relates to methamphetamine precursors; relates to pharmacies, sale and tracking; relates to penalties; requires the Department of State Police to enter into a memorandum of understanding to establish the Commonwealth's participation in a real-time electronic recordkeeping and monitoring system for the nonprescription sale of ephedrine or related compounds; provides a penalty for failure to report sales.
Virginia	2012	VA H 346	Amends provisions governing the practice of nurse practitioners; provides that nurse practitioners shall only practice as part of a patient care team, which shall include at least one licensed patient care team physician; relates to persons licensed to practice osteopathy when taking blood or giving injections; relates to fitting artificial limbs; requires professional liability insurance; relates to prescribing controlled substances.

Virginia	2012	VA H 1301	Relates to budget Bill; provides that appropriations of the Budget providing a portion of revenues for the two years ending respectively on the thirtieth day of June, 2013, and the thirtieth day of June, 2014; relates to a study of restructuring the local Business, Professional, and Occupational License Tax; authorizes an annual food-related inspection fee; relates to third party coverage under a medical support order; requires the modernization of the unemployment insurance benefits and tax system.
