Any effort by Congress or the administration to reverse this ruling is preemptive and diminishes the flexibility of state legislatures to be innovative and responsive to the 19 unique needs of the residents of each state; and 20 21 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that NCSL requests Congress consider 22 the perspective of the states as it examines this issue and asks that it involve state 23 legislators in any federal efforts that seek to reform the regulation of online gaming. 24 NCSL strongly opposes any effort by the federal government to overturn the Justice 25 Department's ruling or consideration of legislation overruling state authority by legalizing 26 27 or regulating gambling at the federal level. NCSL also requests that federal lawmakers

be respectful of state legislatures that prohibit online gaming or other forms of gaming
