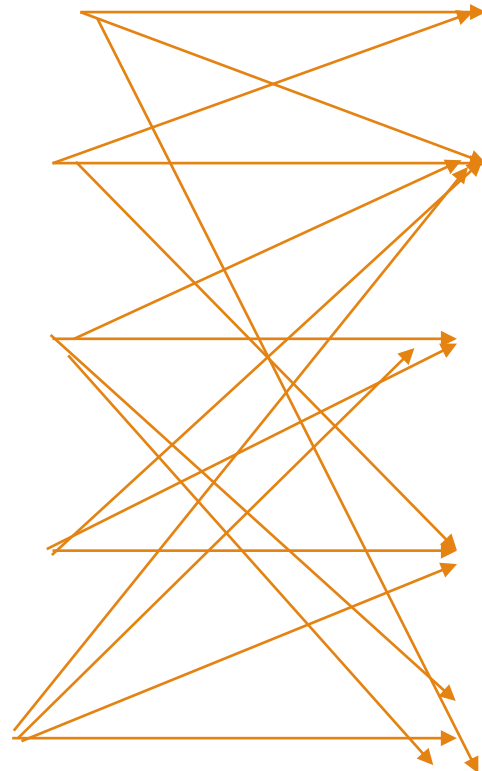

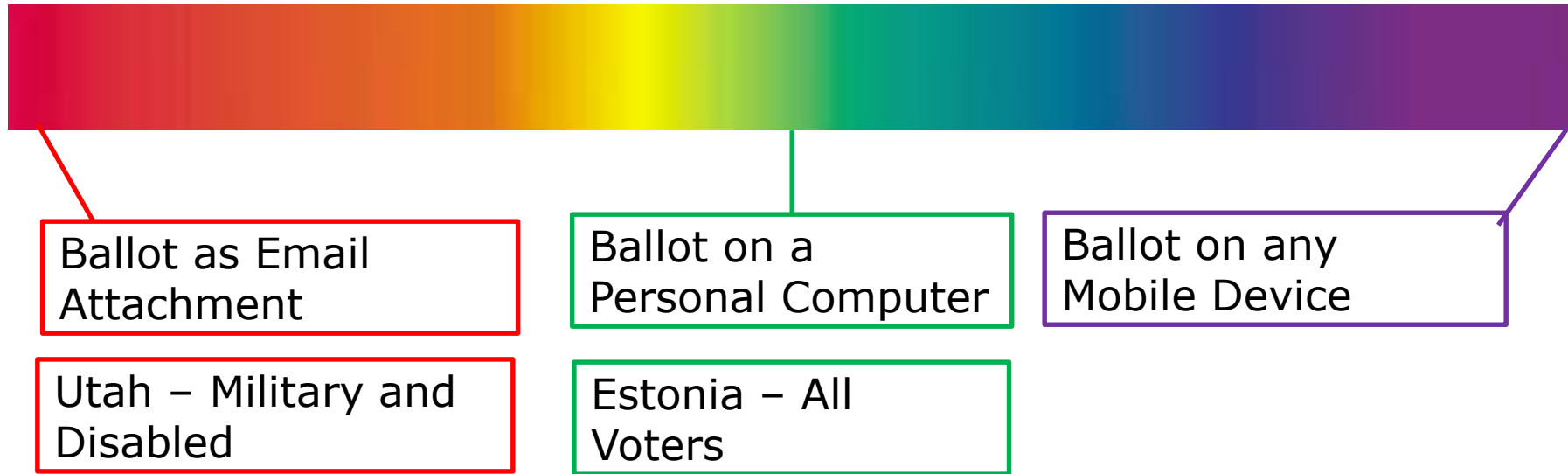
“Voting on home computer, tablet, phone, or other device”

Transmitting a **voted** ballot via the Internet – from a home computer, tablet, phone, kiosk, by email or Internet-based fax

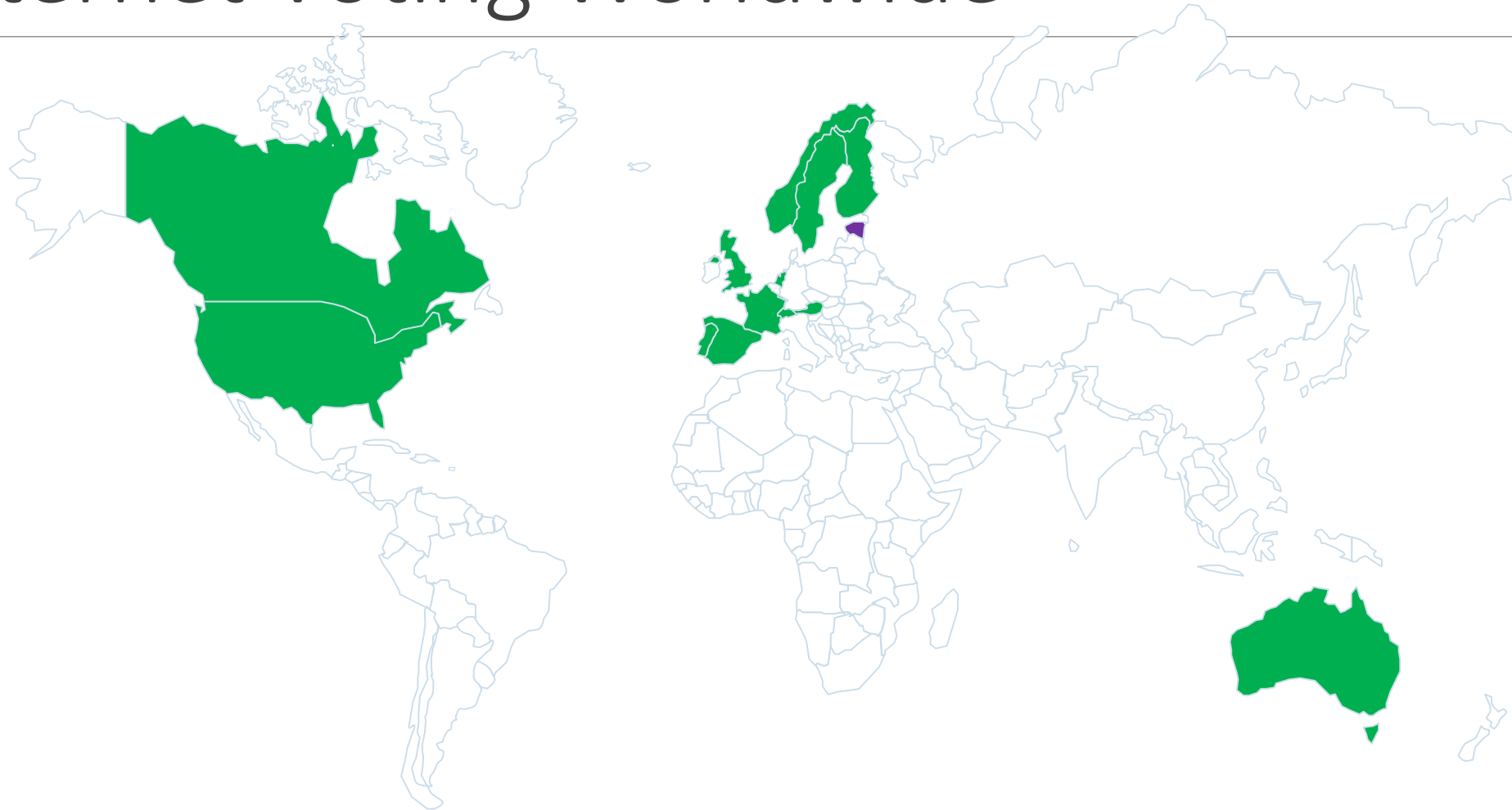
The Spectrum of Internet/Online Voting



□ Three General Classifications

- Receive images of voted ballots (fax/email PDF)
- Voter marks ballot online, administrator prints it
- Pure Internet voting (“without hands”)
