Expansion of Sales Tax to Services

Recently, several states began expanding their sales taxes to services. Proponents believe that the expansion is necessary to maintain the sales tax as a viable revenue stream, given the shift from a goods-based economy to a service-based economy. However, opponents posit that expanding the sales tax to services is too complicated to administer, creates a competitive disadvantage for the state (compared to other states that do not tax services), discriminates against small businesses, and that sales taxes are inherently regressive. This session will continue the discussion from the November meeting concerning how the expansion of the sales tax would affect states.

Property Tax of Telecommunications

The communications industry pays billions of dollars in property taxes to states and local jurisdictions across the country annually. In many states, the industry faces property tax systems designed for a market structure that no longer exists. These laws result in communications providers paying much higher property taxes than other competitive businesses and can significantly increase the cost of investment in broadband networks. As part of its ongoing review of state and local tax policies affecting the communications industry, this panel will provide the Task Force with an overview of communications property taxes, discuss recent litigation on the issue, and highlight state efforts to modernize their property tax systems.

Tax Expenditure Reports

The primary goal of state tax expenditure reports (or budgets) is to provide information to the public and policymakers about preferential tax provisions that reduce overall tax revenue. Proponents of these reports laud them as a critical tool to understand and improve state tax systems. Critics contend, however, that state tax expenditure reports provide inaccurate and

misleading information, particularly with regard to business taxes. This roundtable will continue the discussion of the Task Force's Tax Expenditure Report Working Group that has worked on developing principles for states to consider for their tax expenditure reports.
