

The Process



What We Do & When

- Engage individuals with Substance Use Disorder (SUD)
- Reduce barriers to treatment
- Provide options toward recovery
- Connect to individuals to treatment
- Support & guide through the process
- Provide Narcan and CPR Kits

- Within 72 hours of an overdose
- After family, friends or the client calls to seek treatment
- Immediately after an overdose
- Monday- Friday, 12p-8p

How: 8 Easy Steps

- 1. Recognize that there's a problem.
- 2. \$\$\$.
- 3. Care.
- 4. Network within the local community and beyond.
- 5. "You're NOT in trouble."
- 6. Earn their respect, quickly.
- 7. Be kind, yet direct.
- 8. Follow up and follow through.
