1115 Transformation Waiver

Texas Healthcare Transformation and Quality Improvement Program 1115 Waiver

Regional Health Partnerships (RHPs)

- Are locally-developed confederations of hospitals, providers, academic health science centers, county medical societies, local governments, and consumers.
- Develop four-year plans to:
 - Assess community needs, and
 - Identify strategies to address uncompensated care and delivery system reform.

Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment (DSRIP)

- Incentive payments are provided for completion of a project designed to:
 - Increase access to health care,
 - Enhance quality of care, or
 - Improve the cost-effectiveness of care provided.
- DSRIP project and metric options were designed by the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) and are pending approval from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).
